Authentic Relationships: Technology as Master or Means



AUTHENTIC RELATIONSHIPS

AS WE GATHER...Technology has been saved for last intentionally. Technology is the supreme obstacle that hinders authentic relationships, one that creates numerous barriers and one that fortifies every other obstacle mentioned earlier in this series. It reinforces our inward turn and gives us the world at our fingertips. It drives us away from physical proximity to others, fulfilling us with the illusion that we are more connected now than ever, even if this connection is rarely ever in the same space. It enables us to have fellowship with others on our terms and avoid the messiness and vulnerability of authentic relationships. It promises us more time, yet seems to deliver less of it. Simply put, technology takes each obstacle in the path of our relationships and supersizes it. In our Gospel reading, Jesus offers a solution. As with money,

technology can either be our master *or* it can be a tool used in service of loving God and serving neighbor. We have been purchased by the blood of Jesus. We belong to Him! Let us take direction from Him and use what we have been given, technology included, to glorify Him. May we see technology as a resource that can strengthen authentic relationships as we serve our true Master, Jesus Christ.


