

AS WE GATHER...God's Word is always effective; we cannot truly hear it and remain as we were. What a revelation! Today's scripture readings all reflect this truth. In Acts, Saul, once responsible for the stoning of Stephen, is changed into the apostle Paul, the human author of much of the New Testament. In the vision in Revelation, John's sorrow is drowned out by the hosts of heaven as they praise the Lamb who is worthy to receive all our praise. And in the Gospel, Peter is forgiven for his weak faith on Holy Thursday and given the gracious invitation to follow his Lord. Now it is our turn to be changed—into people freed from sin and death to serve our living Lord.

On behalf of the Board of Parish Education, we would like to share an update for the Fall 2025 Sunday School hour. Starting in January our board began looking more in depth at our current Bible class offerings here at St. Paul along with the demographic those classes are reaching. We have several different offerings during the week at different times, but St. Paul does not offer any classes in which adults and kids can attend at the same time. We currently have Sunday school for 3 years olds to 6th graders at 8:15 – 9:15 and an adult class

offered at 9:30.
