

EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER MINISTRY UPDATE

The ministry expansion project continues to make great progress toward completion. For the last month, the committees reported the following:

Building Committee:

- Exterior stone and brick is nearly complete.
- Stucco has progressed.
- Drywall and interior wall painting has been completed.
- Ceiling grid has been installed.
- Electrical and HVAC finishes are in progress.
- Window installation has begun.

Next 30 days:

- Complete exterior facade.
- Continue window and exterior door installation.
- Continue with mechanical finishes.
- Install ceiling tile.
- Start flooring finishes.

Finance Committee:

- Cumulatively to date, St. Paul has paid more than \$3.7 towards the ministry expansion project.
- Approximately \$1.8 million in promissory notes have been issued to date. For those interested, St. Paul continues to issue promissory notes.
- Presently St. Paul has approximately \$0.6 million of funds on hand to satisfy upcoming construction costs for the next couple of months. During the month of April, St. Paul will begin borrowing from Lutheran Church Extension Fund to assist in financing the remainder of the ministry expansion project through completion.
