

LIGHTING OF CANDLES and RINGING OF THE BELLS

Pastor: These words not only remind us of our baptism, they are the Lord's words which proclaim His promise

and presence. Therefore we are gathered:

All: in the name of the Father, and of the † Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

OPENING SENTENCES Deuteronomy 6:4–9

Pastor: To God's Old Testament people, Moses commanded, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart.

Men: You shall teach them diligently to your children,

Women: and shall talk of them when you sit in your house.

Confirmands: and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

Pastor: The Ten Commandments lead us to realize that we should fear, love, and trust God in every

Pastor: When we pray the Lord's Prayer, we put ourselves at God's disposal, asking that His will and rule

be evident in our daily living.

People: We confess that our will and wants do not always align with God's will. We repent and are

truly sorry.

Pastor: When we recall our Baptism, we remember that the old Adam should be drowned each day and a

new man arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

People: We confess that we, though forgiven saints, are also sinners who give in to the wiles of the

devil, the voices of this world, and our own inner desires. We repent and are truly sorry.

Pastor: When we confess our sins and receive forgiveness, the Absolution is as valid and certain as if Christ

spoke the words Himself.

People: We confess that we are by nature sinful and in need of Your mercy. We repent and are

truly sorry.

Pastor: When we receive the Sacrament of the Altar with our Lord's body and blood, we receive forgiveness

of sins, life, and salvation.

People: Lead us to a greater appreciation of Your gifts.

Pastor: Although we are all sinful and unclean, through Holy Baptism we have been made members of the

Body of Christ, the Church. Our heavenly Father daily and richly forgives all our sins. Purely by grace for Jesus' sake. He gives us eternal life and salvation. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the † Son and of

the Holy Spirit."

SERMON "Seek First What's First," by Pastor Luke Anderson, based on Matthew 6:25-33.

WORDS OF BLESSING

Pastor: This day represents a milestone, not an end, to the study of God's Word and learning how to live out the Christian faith. How will these young men and women here today continue to learn about their Lord Jesus Christ? It will depend, to a great extent, on the influence and example that you, as parents and sponsors, give to them.

Parents and Sponsors, it was not long ago that you presented your child for Holy Baptism. At that time, you promised to bring your child up in a Christian home, to present opportunities to hear and study God's Word, and by your Christian example, encourage your child to grow in their Christian life and faith. They have reached a milestone of their walk today with their Confirmation, however, your responsibilities as parents and sponsors continue. You still have the responsibility and opportunity to make a positive influence in the spiritual life of your child. So I now ask you: Will you encourage your Confirmand by example and encouragement to hear and read God's Word, to attend worship regularly, and to receive the Lord's Supper faithfully? If so, say to your Confirmand these words together:

Parents and Sponsors: We do so promise with the help of God. We love you. We support you. We pray that you, our Confirmand, have a heart that seeks to follow Jesus and remain a part of His body, the Church, until life everlasting. We too, will strive to set the example in worship and discipleship.
