EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER MINISTRY EXPANSION UPDATE

As we near completion of the ministry expansion project, significant activity is occurring. For the last month, the committees reported the following:

Building Committee:

- Emptied south wing classrooms into the new building.
- Completed abatement, as necessary.
- Razed the south wing classrooms.
- New foundation completed at the former south wing connection point.
- Framed new exterior wall.
- Started mechanical rough-ins for bathroom remodels.
- Fire alarm upgrades began in the entire facility.

Upcoming:

- Complete bathroom and corridor rough-ins.
- Window installation in new wall.
- Drywall corridor and bathrooms.
- Ceramic tile in bathrooms.
- Install bathroom fixtures.
- Exterior finishes on new wall.
- New light pole installation.
- Exterior grading/landscaping.
- South lot new asphalt.

Finance Committee:

- St. Paul has paid nearly \$5.5 million towards the ministry expansion project. Approximately \$1.0 million remains to be paid to Catalyst Construction and GROTH Design Group, which will substantially be paid over the next three months.
- To date, St. Paul has issued \$2,031,500 in promissory notes. Semi-annual interest was paid to all promissory noteholders through June 30, 2025.
- St. Paul is borrowing from Lutheran Church Extension Fund to assist in financing the remainder of the ministry expansion project through its completion. During the construction phase, St. Paul will pay LCEF interest only. So far, St. Paul has borrowed \$660,000 in principal from LCEF and paid interest to LCEF of \$6,472.
