

AS WE GATHER...How easy it is to become anxious when things go differently than we had hoped. We worry about ourselves and our loved ones. We experience everyday anxieties and big cosmic ones too. Sometimes anxiety can become so serious that professional help is needed. Paul writes in Philippians 4:6, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Easier said than done, Paul! Jesus invites us to let anxiety be. Concerning the things most of us worry about—like food, clothing, provisions—Jesus observes that just as the birds, the lilies, and the grass are well-provided for, we will be taken care of as well. The adventure of life is one of faith: entrusting ourselves to the care of God, seeking first God's reign, and experiencing the rich provision enjoyed by all of creation as a gift.



EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER MINISTRY EXPANSION UPDATE

The finishing details are being completed as we prepare for occupancy and the beginning of the school year. For the last month, the committees reported the following:

Building Committee:

- South wing was razed.
- Phase 2 remodel of the connector corridor and bathrooms has been completed.
- Final punch list completed.
- Lower parking lot paved.
- Final inspections in progress along with occupancy permit. Landscaping in progress and being completed.

Finance Committee:

- St. Paul has paid nearly \$5.6 million towards the ministry expansion project. Approximately \$0.9 million remains to be paid to Catalyst Construction and GROTH Design Group, which will substantially be paid over the next three months.
- To date, St. Paul has issued nearly \$2.1 million in promissory notes. For those interested, St. Paul continues to issue promissory notes.
- St. Paul is borrowing from Lutheran Church Extension Fund ("LCEF") to assist in financing the remainder of
 the ministry expansion project through its completion. During the construction phase, St. Paul will pay
 LCEF interest only. As of July 31, 2025, St. Paul has borrowed \$740,294 in principal from LCEF and paid
 interest to LCEF of \$11,001. In the coming months, we prepare for our construction loan to be converted to a
 permanent loan as construction is completed and we begin to occupy the new facility.
