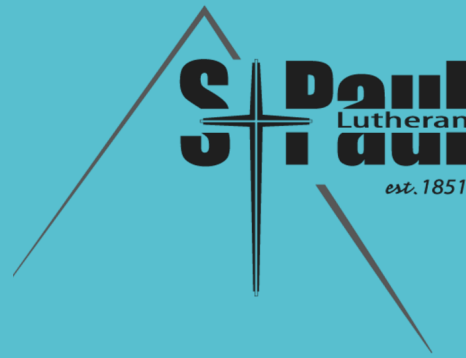

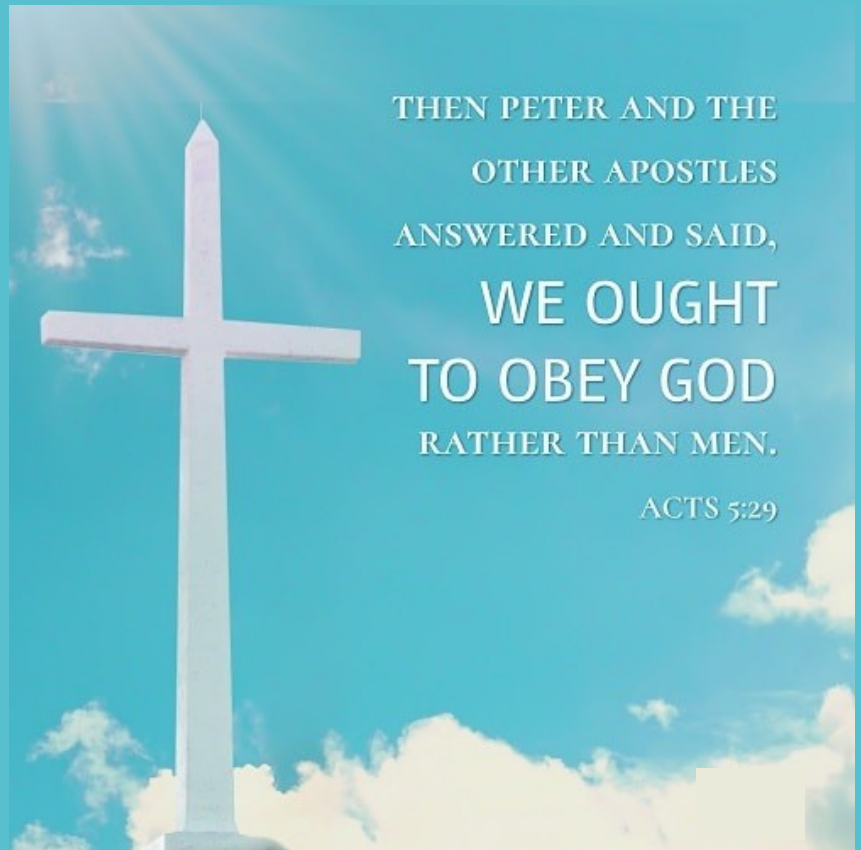

ACTS 5:29

AS WE GATHER...We gather today still in the glow of the most joyous and amazing celebration of Easter, the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, from the dead. The sights and sounds of that celebration linger in our memory, not as just a past event finished and forgotten, but as Peter calls it today, "a living hope," as enduring and strong as the certainty of our living Lord and the promised future of our own resurrection. We return to continue the Easter celebration because in the afterglow of the days since Easter Sunday, many still do not know that hope. Like the absent apostle Thomas, we still face what seems to be a hopeless world. Today we remember that our only hope is built on a divine Savior whose crucifixion wounds were endured for us and for all. Indeed, we are to learn that every Sunday throughout the entire year is an Easter celebration as our living Lord draws us into His holy, life-giving wounds through His very same body and blood given us in Holy Communion. Thomas saw and believed. Peter rejoiced. Though we do not now see Him, "you believe in Him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory" (1 Peter 1:8), the only sure and living hope.

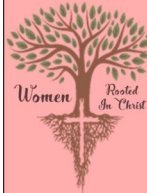

ACCEPTING ENDOWMENT FUND GRANT APPLICATIONS - FISCAL YEAR 2026-2027

In accordance with the distribution policy and bylaws of the St. Paul Endowment Fund, a total of \$45,600 will be available for distribution from the St. Paul Endowment Fund during the 2026-2027 fiscal year (July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027). Endowment grant applications are now being accepted by the St. Paul Endowment Committee. A copy of the endowment grant application is available through the St. Paul Endowment website (splgraffton.org/church/endowment/), in the St. Paul Finance Office, or by contacting Jason Hasenstein, Director of Finance. One of St. Paul's Boards must sponsor each endowment grant application. Please direct any questions regarding endowment grant applications and/or submit any grant applications to Jason Hasenstein, Director of Finance. Grant funds will be distributed as long as endowment funds remain available in the fiscal year.

LWML CHURCH WORK SCHOLARSHIP

Active female members of congregations of the South Wisconsin District (SWD) of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) who are residents of the SWD prior to college and are preparing for full-time* church work in the LCMS are eligible to apply. The applicant must be an undergraduate student at one of the educational institutions of the Synod during the school year in which you would receive this scholarship. Applications must be postmarked by **April 30, 2026** to apply for funds for the 2026-2027 school year. *Full-time service in the church is defined as any position available through the Board of Assignments of the Synod. 8am Traditional Worship; 9:15-10:15am Bible Class Hour for all; 10:30am Contemporary Worship.

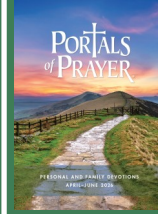

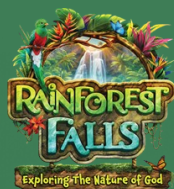
