Light

While living in Chicago, I was once struck by the simple kindness of a stranger who, while we were both stopped for a traffic light, signaled to me that one of my headlights was out. I hadn't realized it myself, driving with only partial light. Yet, once I was made aware, it was replaced, and light stretched a little further ahead of me. More recently while working in our kitchen, I just thought my eyes were yet again getting worse. However, when I eventually discovered the real problem, I positioned a chair under the light fixture and replaced the burned out bulb. Immediately the light reached into the whole room. Even though light had been inching back into our days since late December, I didn't really notice the few extra minutes added to the weeks. I guess I had just become accustomed to that way of life. However, as the calendar noted, this past weekend most of the country spun its clocks forward by an hour, and light lingered into the early evening, pushing back the darkness. Light made a difference.

I know there are times, too, that I am less aware of the Light of the World, or I make excuses for why I'm not fully living in his light. In fact, sins of judgment or worry or apathy can become customary. Then, today the calendar caught me again. In two weeks, it will be Good Friday. Jesus will have already endured so much: betrayals, false accusations, trials, beatings, denials, and a sentence -- death. He would be nailed to and raised up on a cross, his heart aching with love for those he was dying to save and his mother, seeing her son. While on the cross, "from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour." (Matthew 27:45) Soldiers will gamble for his cloak, the Father will turn his back on his Son, and Jesus will give up his spirit. Darkness.

Yet, we know the account doesn't end there. Defeating the devil, rolling back the stone, and overcoming the darkness, is Jesus. Light. While with his disciples, he had said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12) Again, "I have come into the world as light, so that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness." (John 12:46) He is light, and he can't be anything other than what he says he is. Through our faith in him, we have the light of life! Our hurts are healed, our sins forgiven, and our days, and our days open to his guidance and his joy. In response, how can we not let our light shine before others, so that they may see our good works and give glory to our Father who is in heaven. (Matthew 5:16) Light makes a difference.

VBS 2024

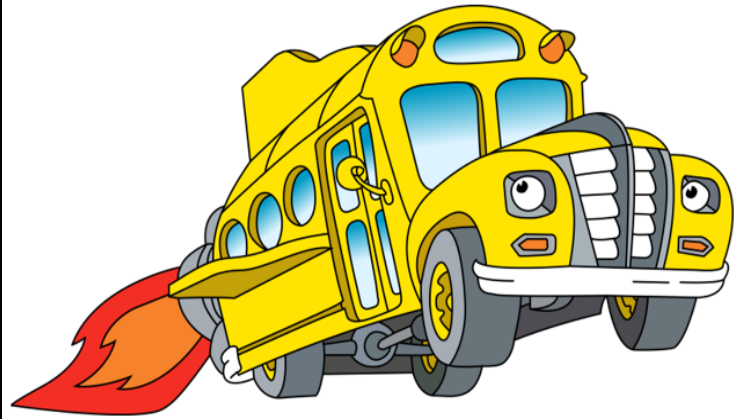
VBS will be June 10-14 this year and we are starting to look for volunteers.
