At the Voters meeting Thursday evening, in a near unanimous vote, members approved moving forward with the ministry expansion vision. 1. Total ministry expansion budget not to exceed \$6.7M through a combination of campaign funds and debt.
2. Building Committee appointed will continue and will be responsible for building project decisions and oversight within the budget set above.
3. Building Finance Committee (to be appointed by Church Council) will be chaired by the Director of Finance and will be responsible for financing and borrowing decisions within the budget set above. In order to meet the completion goal of August, 2025, work will begin immediately to finalize the design, obtain required permits, and secure financing sources.

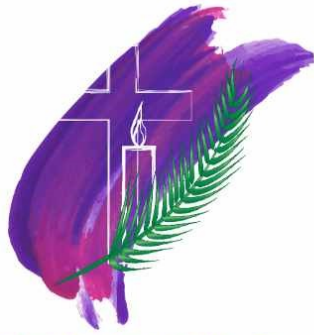

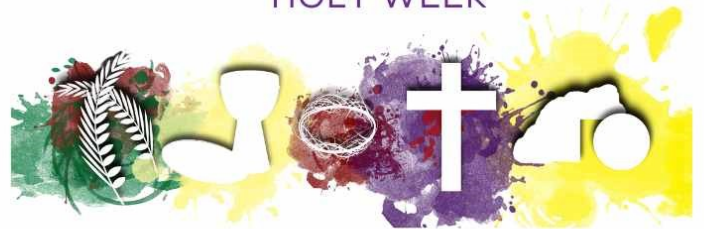
