## The Triumphal Entry

Sunday is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. I have always enjoyed this week leading up to Easter.

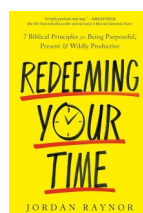

## New! Women's Bible Study: Redeeming Your Time by Jordan Raynor

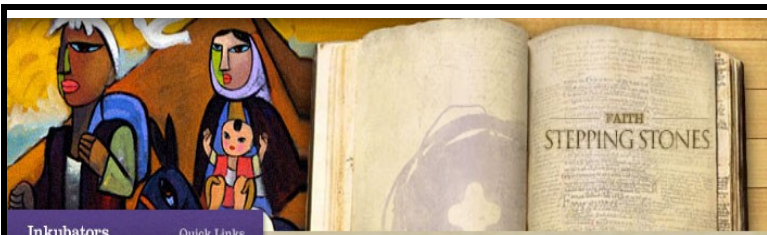
