May Our Hearts Burn

Following Easter, the 3rd grade Religion curriculum goes through one of my favorite Bible stories in that of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Perhaps you are familiar. There's two guys walking from Jerusalem to their hometown when a stranger approaches and asks why they are so sad. The men retell the events of the Easter weekend and can't believe the stranger is unaware. The stranger joins them on the walk and begins to explain what scripture says. Once they get to their town, they invite the stranger into their home to share a meal. It's not until the stranger breaks bread with them that they recognize him to be Jesus who then vanishes. In Luke 24:32 the men say to each other, "Did not our hearts not burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the Scriptures?" This burning was a specialness of being in God's presence. It can be very powerful to be in God's presence.

Thinking about the "hearts burning within us, reminds me of a song. Those of you that grew up in the Lutheran church in a similar time period as I may be familiar with a singing duo called "Lost and Found". One of my favorite songs of theirs is *Hearts on Fire*. In this song they talk about how special it is to be in the presence of God. The chorus is simple stating "Hearts on fire, baby, yeah, hearts on fire!" The verses talk about different times in scripture where people would have felt the presence of God such as the raising of Jairus's daughter, doubting Thomas, healing the lame man, and the Last Supper. Surely these were moments where people felt the presence of God.

Perhaps you have had your heart burn within you, where you felt the presence of God. It may have been a joyous occasion filled with excitement or a time that was more subdued. Regardless, you've felt it....the presence of God. Hopefully the burning didn't end there. Hopefully you were like the Emmaus disciples who ran back to Jerusalem to share with other Jesus followers. Let the burning in your heart not stop, but burn brightly so that others may see God in you.






