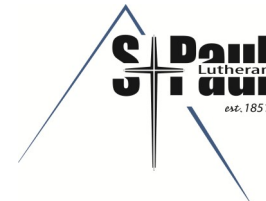

## God’s GOLD Medal Winners!

The 2026 Winter Olympics have begun and it’s been so much fun to learn about the journeys of the USA Olympians. The road to the Olympics is long, tiresome and filled with ups and downs. The Olympians also have sponsors who help guide, direct and support them in their journey. Then, their training and event comes to an end! Only a memory – nothing for eternity!

We may not be training to be an Olympian athlete, but we are training to be an athlete for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. How are you training for this once in a lifetime event?

When Paul wrote 1 Timothy 4:8, he acknowledged something we all probably know at heart—physical health matters.

In Paul's time, athletic training was a sign of discipline and strength. Today, we also recognize how sleep, nutrition, and exercise impact our well-being. Taking care of our bodies is important because they are a gift from God. But Paul reminds us that while physical training has value, it’s not enough on its own. We need something more—something deeper that sustains us beyond the ups and downs of life. That something is godliness.

Godliness isn’t just about avoiding bad habits. It’s about shaping our lives around God’s presence and purpose. Just as physical training strengthens our bodies, spiritual training—through prayer, Scripture, and obedience—strengthens our souls. God is our Sponsor- He guides, directs and supports us though life’s ups and downs.

Mathew 6:33 says “Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.” When we seek Him first, we discover that godliness doesn’t just prepare us for eternity, it also transforms how we live right now. A healthy life—mentally, physically, and spiritually—starts with seeking Him first.

1Timothy 4:8 says “for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of one value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come”.

Just as physical training strengthens our bodies, spiritual training – prayer, studying Scripture, and walking in daily obedience – strengthens our souls.

When we make a habit of seeking God, we learn that godliness doesn’t just prepare us for eternity – it also transforms how we live ad love right now. In God’s eyes, we are GOLD Medal winners for HIS kingdom!

*God, thank you for caring about my whole being – both mind, and soul. Help me to train not just for physical health, but for spiritual godliness. Not just for what’s temporary, but what will last forever. Shape my thoughts, action and purpose to align with your will. Strengthen me to pursue what truly lasts. In Jesus’ name. Amen.*
