Living in Hope... and Living in Love

This past week, several students came up to me hoping for something — hoping to make it to the State Basketball Tournament or hoping to do well on a test.

It made me think: isn't it amazing how much of our lives is spent hoping? We hope for material things, for a better job, or even just for a good night's sleep. We hope our favorite teams make it to the championship. We hope things go the way we want them to go.

But life doesn't always unfold the way we hope. There are unexpected and unplanned events that interrupt our plans. There are disappointments. There are moments when what we hoped for simply doesn't happen. Yet there is one thing we never have to *hope* for.

We do not have to hope for the love of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

His love is not uncertain. It is not based on our performance. It is not something we earn. It is constant. He is always with us. We are His forgiven children. The Holy Spirit lives within us. His love is not wishful thinking — it is a promise.

In **1 John 4:16**, we are reminded:

“So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him.”

Notice those words: *come to know and to believe*. This isn't a shaky hope. It is confident assurance.

So the next time you find yourself hoping for something — whether big or small — remember this: Jesus' love for you is already secure. You don't have to wish for it. You don't have to earn it. It is yours.

Put your faith in Him. Trust that He has the best intentions for your life, even when things don't go as you planned. And then let His love shine through you in the way you speak, act, and care for others.

Isn't it wonderful that we have such a loving and compassionate God?
