## Psalm 37:

I was typically the pack-mommy – carrying all that we took to the beach plus a kid or two, so it was no easy feat getting up those stairs to the next set of steps that got us home. I, more than once, slipped and dropped all the gear I was carrying.

Sometimes, I feel that heavy load as I walk through the day. I feel the weight of my sin and wrong doings. I know that I slip and don't follow God's plan for me. This Lenten season, I am thankful for the time to reflect on my sin, but more importantly, it gives me time to see God in my everyday life. I see that He has been gracious, merciful and kind. I see that He has been there to pick up the heavy load that I carry. He has been faithful as He promised.

As I have been reading through the Psalms, the psalmist gives us a view of God as the one who delights in us, has us by the hand, has our backs when we stumble or mess up, and is our source of firm support in difficult times. This Lenten season, I pray that you see this vision of God - who willingly receives our confession, extends forgiveness, and provides what we need. I'm so thankful that He is always holding my hand – and He has yours too!

## Accepting Endowment Fund Grant Applications - Fiscal Year 2026/2027

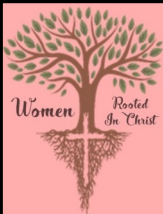

### Grafton Summer Learning Academy

Registration opens for students recommended for reading or math support on Wednesday, March 18. Parents will be notified if their child needs extra assistance in reading or math by Friday, March 13. Online registration will open for everyone on Thursday, April 9 with staggered start times based on grade level.

#### New & Non-District Students

You may need to pre-register your child if they aren't currently enrolled into the Grafton School District to gain access to registration for summer school.

- Students new to the district (4K, 5K, and above) who have already completed enrollment paperwork to start school in Fall 2026, DO NOT need to complete this form to have access to register on April 9.

- Parochial school students, homeschool students, and other students in the community must complete this form to have access this year, even if they attended summer school last year.

- Non-residents should fill the form out, but can only enroll in enrichment classes (if space is available) beginning on May 1 and will be charged a \$50 fee per class. Skyward Family Access Login Information will be emailed once students are entered into the system. Since classes do fill up quickly, we recommend that you fill out the pre-registration form as soon as possible.

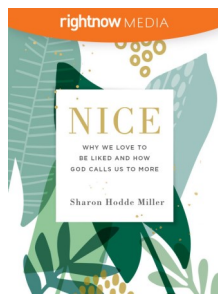

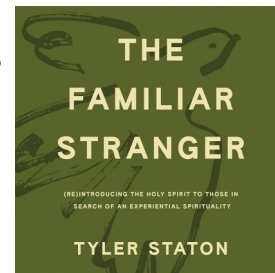


## **Nice** by Sharon Hodde Miller—[Nice :: RightNow Media](#)

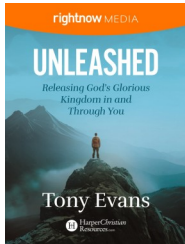
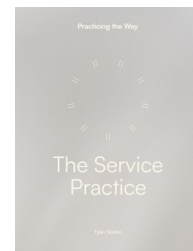
## **The Familiar Stranger** by Tyler Staton

Have you ever felt there's a gap between the life promised in the Bible and the one you're living? For many followers of Jesus, the Holy Spirit is a familiar stranger—a rumored figure we know of, but don't truly know. We hear stories of God's power but struggle to see it in our own lives.
