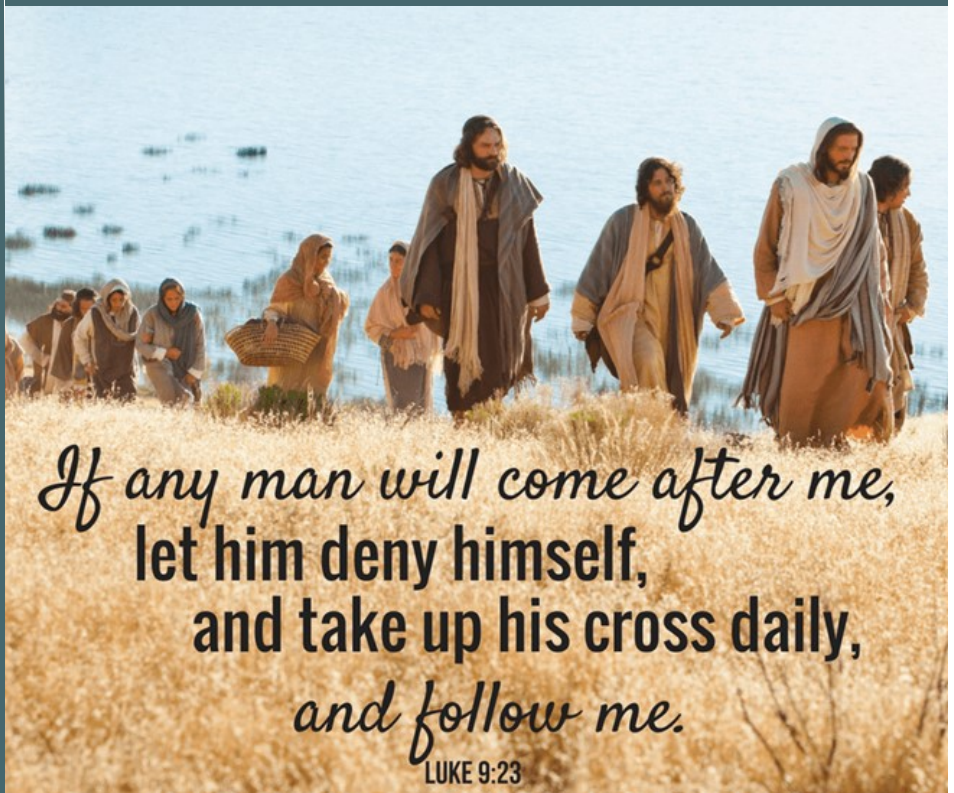

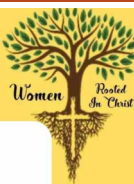
SAVE THE DATE: Weekend of July 26-28, 2025

For the past 36 years MOST Ministries has been helping LCMS church members experience international mission work.

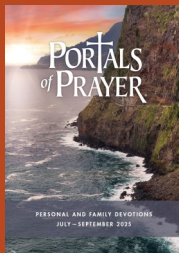
